Coma and Brain Death (Dr Merchut) Coma 1 Clinical features of coma Coma is defined as a sleep-like, unarousable, unresponsive state Other patients with impaired consciousness but some limited degree of responding are described as obtunded or stuporous In coma, only brain stem reflexes are clinically testable, since cortical function is absent

Coding Guidelines Excludes 1 note for R40-R46 which includes coma and GCS when they are part of a pattern of a mental disorder (F01-F99) •Psych conditions, dementia, intellectual disability, as well as alcohol and drug use, abuse, dependence, intoxication, etc

Glasgow Coma Scale was designed to assess depth of coma after head injury in adults and has been used in paediatric non-traumatic coma1-3 Although alternatives such as the Ses-hia scale have less interobserver variability, probably because there are fewer choices,4 the Glasgow scale is ...

### **Glasgow Coma Scale - Centers for Disease Control and ...**

Glasgow Coma Scale Eye Opening Response • Spontaneous--open with blinking at baseline 4 points • To verbal stimuli, command, speech 3 points • To pain only (not applied to face) 2 points • No response 1 point Verbal Response

### **NIHSS tips for coma or confused pt**

Scale Item Coma Difficult or Confused Tips 1a LOC Responsiveness 2 - for some movement 3 - Flaccid or no movement 0 - if awake, alert Can usually tell score by greeting 1 - ET tube, trauma, severe dysarthria; 2 - Aphasia, stupor, confusion 1c LOC Commands 2 2 - if unable to understand or follow the commands You are not testing grip strength

### **Brain function in brain death, coma, vegetative state ...**

Coma Coma is characterized by the absence of arousal and thus also of consciousness It is a state of unarousable unresponsiveness in which the patient lies with the eyes closed and has no awareness of self and surroundings The patient lacks the spontaneous periods of wakefulness

Coma patients exhibit a complete absence of wakefulness and are unable to consciously feel, speak or move Comas can be derived by natural causes, or can be medically induced Clinically, a coma can be defined as the inability to consistently follow a one-step command

**European Academy of Neurology guideline on the diagnosis ...**

Scientific Panel on Coma and Chronic Disorders of Consciousness, representing 10 European countries, reviewed the scientific evidence for the evaluation of coma and other DoC using standard bibliographic measures Recommendations followed the Grading of Recommendations Assessment, Development and Evaluation (GRADE) system

coma (GCS 7-10), and light coma (GCS 11-14) Kater noted that the difference in cognitive level scores was greatest for those patients in the moderate coma severity group Patients in deep coma also seemed to benefit from the stimulation, though patients in the light coma severity group demonstrated very little
